Project TDA Article 3 Grant Application (P.W. 409-5)

#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the Parks and Recreation Commission, acting as the Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee (PBAC) for the City of Antioch, adopt the attached Resolution of Support for Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements Project TDA Article 3 grant application for new curb ramps and sidewalks at: "A" Street from Beede Way to Wilbur Avenue; Cavallo Road at East 13th Street; "G" Street at Marsh Middle School; Putnam Street from Contra Loma Boulevard to Mission Drive, Carpinteria Drive from Graphite Court to Garrow Bridge and new curb ramps at various locations.

# DISCUSSION

On January 12, 2016, the City Council approved a resolution of support to submit an application requesting an allocation of the Transportation Development Act (TDA) Article 3 Pedestrian/Bicycle Project Funds to install new curb ramps and sidewalk improvements at: "A" Street from Beede Way to Wilbur Avenue; Cavallo Road at East 13th Street; "G" Street at Marsh Middle School, Putnam Street from Contra Loma Boulevard to Mission Drive and Carpinteria Drive from Graphite Court to Garrow Bridge. The project will also include new curb ramps at various locations, as shown on Exhibit "A" of the Resolution.

The new curb ramps, sidewalks and bicycle lanes will improve pedestrian and bicycle safety and facilitate accessibility to nearby schools, trails, and business areas. The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) requested that, in addition to the City Council resolution of support, the project sponsor submit documentation of review, discussion and support by the City's PBAC with the application for federal funding for this project.

WHEREAS, on August 11, 2015, the Antioch City Council appointed the Parks and Recreation Commission as the Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee (PBAC) for the City of Antioch; and

WHEREAS, on May 19, 2016, the Parks and Recreation Commission acting as the Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee (PBAC) for the City of Antioch recommended safety projects as one of the priorities for bicycle and pedestrian improvements in the City; and

WHEREAS, at a noticed meeting of the Parks and Recreation Commission on January 19, 2017, the Commission, acting as the PBAC, reviewed, discussed, and supported the application for Fiscal Year 17/18 Transportation Development Act Article 3 funding consisting of:

- "A" Street from Beede Way to Wilbur Avenue curb ramps and island modifications;
- · Cavallo Road at East 13th Street sidewalk gap closure;
- "G" Street at Marsh Middle School curb ramps and miscellaneous path of travel improvements;
- Putnam Street from Contra Loma Boulevard to Mission Drive sidewalk gap closure;
- Carpinteria Drive from Graphite Court to Garrow Bridge bicycle lane and sidewalk;
- New curb ramps at various locations shown on Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the City of Antioch desires to submit a request to MTC for the allocation of TDA Article 3 funds to support the projects described in Exhibit A to this resolution, which are for the exclusive benefit and/or use of pedestrians and/or bicyclists;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the project was reviewed on January 19, 2017 by the Parks and Recreation Commission, the designated PBAC for the City of Antioch and the designated representative; and furthermore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements Project will provide improved safety for bicyclists and pedestrians; and furthermore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that a certified copy of this resolution and its attachments, and any accompanying supporting materials shall be forwarded to the congestion management agency, countywide transportation planning agency, or county association of governments, as the case may be, of Contra Costa County for submission to MTC as part of the countywide coordinated TDA Article 3 claim.



#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the Parks and Recreation Commission, acting as the Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee (PBAC) for the City of Antioch, adopt the attached Resolution of Support for "L" Street Pathway to Transit Project - OBAG Grant Funding Application.

# DISCUSSION

On December 9, 2016, staff submitted a \$2,279,000 federal grant funding application for One Bay Area Grant (OBAG 2) Program for the project to improve pedestrian and bicycle facilities along "L" Street from Highway 4 to the Antioch Marina, to provide safe routes and access to schools, trails, the County Fairgrounds, the downtown area, Police Services building, the Marina Boat Launch Ramp and major transit facilities, including the Amtrak Station and the future Ferry Terminal Station.

The project will include new sidewalks, bike lanes, curb ramps, parking facility improvements, bus shelters, trail access and traffic signals improvement.

Staff has received letters of support from TransPlan and Tri-Delta Transit for this project. The attached resolution will provide local support of the Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee (PBAC) for the project grant application.


